Hello Currie families

Sometimes during this time of year we see an escalation of instances where students are needing our guidance to solve problems peacefully and respectfully. This could be becuase of the added events and disruptions in schedules, the anticipation of summer, or a number of other reasons. Thank you for your partnerships as we continue to support our students and to teach them to care for self, place and others. Below is some additional information on some of the strategies that we may use.

Our School's strategies to adress unwanted behaviours:

At Currie, we strive to teach our students how to learn to work together, collaborate, and to be kind, caring and productive members of a diverse and inclusive learning community. As we invite students to be part of their

learning communities, we find that our students are at different points on their learning journeys in all areas of learning, especially social responsibility.

Each learner comes to us with a variety of skills to negotiate being part of a larger group. Our staff works together to collectively teach our students how to learn and be kind to self, others, and their environment.

We expect that our students will encounter situations that require positive problem-solving skills as well as help from the educators in our Currie community. Approaches we take as we support students are dependent on a number of factors such as age and development of the student, and the context of the problem.

Our approaches to supporting our students learn social responsibility skills are complex and context-specific.

We work together with parents to support our learners, together we are better. We strive towards collaborating working together to support the growth and learning of our students.

We follow our own Currie code of conduct ,"Currie Cares" as well as the District Code of Conduct – which governs our interactions with all members of our community, including students, staff and parents.

Some of the strategies that are taught and used are:

- Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their actions
- Students are taught to apologize using the Four Part Apology model
- Opportunities for relationship repair such as supervised play or working on projects or tasks together for students in conflict
- Whole class learning of strategies for social emotional growth
- Small group instruction and coaching for problem solving and social skills
- Teaching strategies such as "WITS"

Our approach is progressive and involves using these opportunities for our students to grow and learn. At times, we may need to contact parents to help support a child's learning. At times, students may be asked to stay off the playground for a period of time or be asked to play in an area where there is more adult supervision to support peaceful problem solving. Our approaches to supporting our students learn social responsibility skills are complex and context-specific, so they are not identical for each occurrence.

Thank you for supporting this School and District -wide approach: together we are better. If you have questions about your own child's social emotional development please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher or Mrs. Hoffinger. And, of course, in no circumstance is it acceptable to speak about other students in a negative or harmful way to other parents.
